Here in Japan, people train to prepare for natural disasters from elementary school. Most people who come to Miyazaki from other countries have never experienced disasters such as earthquakes and typhoons, and have no idea about how to train to prepare for them. We had a seminar last year by international exchange students from Kumamoto University who had experienced the 2016 Kumamoto earthquake - they had never experienced an earthquake before that, and they had never even heard the word "Hinanjo." They would like to tell as many people as possible that we cannot prevent natural disasters, but can at least be prepared.

Please inform the foreign residents around you about the importance of evacuation drills. Also, if you can, please take part in the Disaster Management Seminar on October 26! Y
