## Japanese Language Courses (Nihongo kōza) \* Reservation Required

Participants can learn Japanese from textbooks with a Japanese Language Teacher in small groups (of around 10 people).

Target Audience: Anyone from overseas living in Miyazaki, anyone looking to start learning Japanese, anyone looking to learn how to read and write Japanese.

Course Fee: Free (Participants will need to buy their own textbooks)
