# A Brief Introduction to the Miyazaki International Foundation



The Miyazaki International Foundation (MIF) works to promote internationalization and intercultural exchange throughout Miyazaki Prefecture. We also organize events and courses to deepen friendships and encourage mutual understanding with people of all nations, and help to support people from overseas who live in Miyazaki. In this month's *Living in Miyazaki*, we will give a brief introduction to the Miyazaki International Foundation and the sort of things we do:

## - Promoting Internationalization

We can dispatch instructors and organize classes to increase awareness of different cultures at schools and other places around the area. We also arrange classes and talks on other countries' cultures given by people from overseas living here in Miyazaki.

## Encouraging Exchange

To provide more opportunities for residents of Miyazaki Prefecture to interact with people from overseas, we organize various events, such as the "Friends of the World" International Festival, opportunities to chat with Coordinators for International Relations from the Prefectural Government, and Chat Sessions where people can speak with volunteers in English, Chinese or Korean. We also support regional groups and organizations that work to promote international exchange.

### Supporting Residents from Overseas

We organize Japanese Language courses and practice sessions for people from overseas living here in Miyazaki, as well as training sessions on disaster response and preparedness. We also operate the Miyazaki Support Center for Foreign Residents, where people from overseas can stop by for assistance with any problems that they may be facing.

### - Lending of Books, Costumes, Flags and World Boxes

Visitors can borrow books on multiculturalism, international cooperation, overseas study, books in foreign languages, Japanese language textbooks and teaching materials, and much more. We also have flags, toys, instruments, CDs, books from, and information on, various countries available to lend for free.
