An Englishman in Miyazaki

"To Infinity... And Beyond! "

Hi everyone! I hope you're all keeping well. Yes, I know the Toy Story quote I used for the title this month is a little old (27 years old, to be precise. Boy did realising that make me feel young!), but please bear with me, because I've been harbouring a deep, dark secret: Eagle-eyed readers of this column may well already know, but a long time ago, I used to be an experimental physicist. I always remember that admitting it to people back in the bar at university would invariably open up far more space around me on the dance floor than current social distancing rules require (...that might actually come in handy during the pandemic, now that I think about it!). Although, I must be honest – after that had happened enough times, I eventually just started lying and told people I was a geographer. The reason I bring it up, though, is because of an idiom that's particularly pervasive in the English language: when someone wants to point out that something is simpler than it might look and doesn't need worrying about, they typically say "it's not rocket science." Presumably because the first image that comes to mind about rocket science is the thought of a lot of white coat-wearing, complicated equations on chalkboards and the occasional explosion. The reality of it is, however, that the maths isn't actually all that complicated - most of the principles used have literally been around for centuries if not millennia, and as long as you take your time and don't make any careless mistakes, you'll get the right numbers just fine. Let's face it - if an idiot like me can do it, anyone can. The real difficulty lies in the actual building of the thing, simply because the tolerances and margins for error are so small. But isn't that more in the realm of engineering and fabrication? Maybe the
