"Here's looking at you, kid."

Hi everyone! I hope you're all keeping well. The quote I used for the title is a famous one from a real classic movie - no, not Gigli. Casablanca! It's one of my all-time favourites, and re-watching it recently got me thinking about why people love movies and stories in general. Some scholars claim it's entirely about escapism - the idea of vicariously living out our fantasies through fictional characters, going to places we would never get to, doing things we would never do in our boring lives, and so on. Personally, though, I'm not so sure about that - not least because (pandemic aside), traveling to far-flung exotic places is nowhere near as difficult as it was in the time of Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman, for example. If you want to learn to drive a car or motorcycle like an action movie hero, or learn martial arts or get weapons training, you can do that, too. Of course, there are some things that happen a lot in stories that are a little trickier to do in real life, such as time travel, magic and zapping marshmallow brand mascots the size of skyscrapers with ghost-destroying lasers, but I'm not sure if even those kinds of things are only about escapism. For one thing, if it is, then why is there such a verbose community of people who complain about the lack of realism in some movies? As we can see from cave paintings and other related pre-history, a lot of humankind's earliest culture was in the form of stories and storytelling, and so some people think that our fondness for it comes from humans' desire to reach out, band together and communicate with one another.

We're social animals - that's one reason why the restrictions around the pandemic have been so hard on a lot of people! So, with that in mind, if there's someone you haven't been able to see for a while, make sure to get back in touch with them, and share the stories of what you've been up to - and why not indulge the escapism side of things with some embellishment and throw in a few accounts of car chases and crowd-pleasing one-liners while you're at it? It'll make you both laugh, if nothing else!
