

#### Disaster preparedness / crime prevention information mail service (available in multiple languages)



## " The Way to the Heart is Through the Stomach "



Hi everyone, nice to meet you! I'm Maggie from the United States. This is my first article in Plaza News. よろしくお願いします! I've only been in Japan for a few months, but I'm doing my best to learn Japanese. I've been surprised to find Japanese and English have some phrases in common, like "I have a separate stomach for dessert!" デザートは別腹です! (Is this really a common phrase? It certainly is for me at least!)

After all, it's hard to beat ice cream when it's so hot. I still haven't tried shaved ice (かき氷) though! Actually, shaved ice is a local specialty in New Orleans, Louisiana. That's where my mom is from. Shaved ice is called sno-balls there because the ice is shaved super thin so that it's more like snow than ice. One popular topping is condensed milk! New Orleans has a lot of local specialties. It's a very unique place with a different culture from the rest of the US. The US has a lot of different cultural influences—all the Native American tribes, British, Mexican, Chinese, etc.—and New Orleans is heavily French! Specifically, it's Creole and Cajun culture, which includes stuff like Jazz music, endless festivals, and of course special cuisine. I find it funny that red beans are usually a dessert in Japan because I grew up eating "red beans and rice" of the cajun style where it's made with a thick roux and served for dinner. Traditionally, it takes all day to make, but nowadays you can get canned red beans and make it much guicker.

I confess, I've never actually lived in New Orleans. But my mom brought the culture with her when she moved to other places in the US and passed it on to my siblings and me. My sister lives in South Korea now and regularly makes red beans

and rice! I think the red beans in Japan are different from what we use in the US, but I hope to make red beans and rice for my friends here sometime. I'm not very good at cooking, but food is a great way to connect with people. I hope that everyone will like my red beans and rice, and I look forward to eating more and more Miyazaki food!
