


A Message from the Miyazaki Support Center for Foreign Residents

Miyazaki Prefecture CIR **Eilidh Galloway**

" An unusually complex self-introduction"

Hi everyone, I'm Eilidh the new Miyazaki prefectural CIR from Scotland. This is my first article for the Plaza news, よろしくお願い いたします。

I'm sure many of you took one look at my name and thought how on earth do you pronounce that?! My name is actually Gaelic, which is an old Celtic language that was predominately spoken in Ireland and the West coast of Scotland. Although I myself cannot actually speak any Gaelic, my parents decided to burden me with a name from my home country just to make it that much more difficult to introduce myself whenever I meet new people. For those who are interested, my name kind of phonetically sounds like 'Ai-lay', the 'd' and 'h' are silent. In Scotland, particularly on the West coast and the islands, street signs and place names are written both in English and Gaelic. We even have Gaelic ambulances that say 'Ambaileans'! Don't worry though, if you ever have to use an ambulance in Scotland you don't need to be able to speak Gaelic.

As I said, although I have no literary ability when it comes to Gaelic, apart from explaining that it is the reason for the slightly unusual spelling of my name, I think it is really important that old languages or dialects of countries don't get forgotten. Even though it takes me an extra 15 minutes to introduce myself compared to the average person, I'm proud to have a name that is so intrinsically connected to my homeland. I hope to use these articles as a way of introducing all the weird and wonderful parts of Scotland to you all. Until next time!
