Just a stone's throw away from the train station in Xinbei City, next to New Taipei City, there is Myanmar Town. Along Huaxin Street, in addition to Myanmar, Yunnan Shan tribe, and Thai cuisine, there are stores specialising in Southeast Asian ingredients. In the 1990s, Taiwan began accepting immigrants from overseas in accordance with the "Southbound Policy" as a countermeasure against labour shortages. There are many immigrants, especially people from Myanmar, living in this city, and a mix of various cultures.

In Miyazaki, among the nationalities of foreigners living in the prefecture, the population of Vietnamese is the highest. As far as I know, there are Vietnamese-owned restaurants and grocery stores in Miyazaki, Ebino, and Miyakonojo.

It may take a little courage to walk into such a store or talk to a foreigner you meet, but by even taking just a small step like saying a simple greeting, wouldn't you say it could help deepen the relationship between members of the same

community? As residents living in the same area, by interacting and taking an interest in one another, you may be able to further connections with foreigners. (Staff: U)

"Mothering Sunday"

It's March, officially springtime, I think. In the UK, the equivalent of Mother's Day in many other countries is called Mothering Sunday and takes place every year sometime in mid-March. It is a special day dedicated to celebrating the life and love which mother's give to their children.

Mothering Sunday has been celebrated in the UK on the fourth Sunday in Lent since the 16th century. Most countries use the US date for Mother's Day on the second Sunday in May, while others choose the 8th of March which is International Women's Day. However, the date of Mothering Sunday changes every year in the UK since it is relative to other holidays on the calendar. Held annually on the 4th Sunday of the Lent season, Mothering Sunday in the UK is always three weeks before Easter Sunday.

Many families in the UK celebrate with traditional parties and events. In some families, children wake up early on the morning of Mothering Sunday to prepare for the baking of special cakes while others have modernised it to the point of it being like other holidays on the UK calendar, arranging activities like going out for lunch or dinner or going shopping.

Although the date for Mother's Day may vary country to country, it is nice to know that many places have a special day to celebrate and show appreciation to mothers. Even though it is not in season in Japan this month, maybe I'll be able to find a nice Sakura themed pop-up card to send back to my mum in the UK. I just hope the UK Post Office doesn't lose it!
