It's good to be prepared!

Miyazaki gets a lot of typhoons, and it's not uncommon around this time of year to see several of them when you check the weather forecast. Also, there's a lot of concern lately about the possibility of a large earthquake happening in the Nankai Trough. Since Miyazaki faces the Pacific Ocean, if a large earthquake were to happen, besides the damage caused by the quake itself, there is also a serious risk of a large amount of damage that could be caused by the resulting tsunami. There is a Japanese saying: "Sonae areba



urei nashi." It means, 'the most important thing when it comes to natural disasters is to be prepared beforehand'. Make sure to make every preparation to ensure your safety.

- 1. Find the nearest evacuation sites from the 'disaster prevention map' or 'hazard map', issued by the local government.
- 2. Decide where you will meet and how you will communicate with your family and friends if an earthquake occurs.
- 3. Make sure your Passport, Residence Card (*zairyu* card), Bankbook and other valuables are stored somewhere safe and easily accessible. Also, be sure to have emergency stocks of food, water, spare medication, a torch, and other important items ready in case you get cut off.
- 4. Get to know your neighbours, so you can help each other out in the event of a disaster. We also recommend joining your Local Residents' Association. You can ask people who live nearby for more about your Local Residents' Association.
- 5. Take part in disaster drills and training, and learn as much as you can about evacuation shelters, food distribution and so on in your local area.
