









Confessions of a scaredy-cat

#### " Break Out the Bento"

What do you usually have for your lunch break? Something from outside, or a packed lunch? Japan has a world-famous packed lunch culture in bento, the iconic black-and-red boxes with various delightful food items artfully arranged inside. After my first few weeks in Miyazaki subsisting mostly on conbini meals for my lunches, I was determined to start making my own bento each morning.

This required something of an adjustment. I've always brought lunch to work back home, but that was usually a sandwich, or a quick pasta salad. A Japanese-style bento with rice and a selection of sides seemed daunting by comparison; rice takes such a long time to cook, after all, and I have no experience home-cooking Japanese okazu. And then my friend pointed out that any decent rice cooker is equipped with a timer. "You can wake up to freshly cooked rice ready to go," she said, and the mere idea of that was so appealing that I didn't waste any more time wondering how to do bento exactly right, and just went for it. I bought the rice cooker, set it to be ready for 7AM, and since then, I've made up my bento on as many mornings as I can. I usually panfry a salmon fillet – more effort than a cheese sandwich, perhaps, but utterly worth it.

This life change has felt like a key step on the path to really living in Japan, not just staying for a while. Our morning routines and cooking habits are so culturally ingrained, and it can be tempting to cling to them when abroad for a feeling of familiarity. But the new quickly becomes familiar, and you end up with new simple pleasures, like the smell of fresh rice first thing in the morning.
