Confessions of a scaredy-cat

" How to Survive a Miyazaki Summer"

Do you remember a time when you looked forward to summer? When summer was the time soak up the sunlight and eat ice cream, not stay indoors and wait for it to be cool enough to tolerate a trip to the shops? That cheerful Beatles classic "Here Comes the Sun" is less of a hopeful prayer and more of a threat these days. As summers get hotter each year, the problem of natsu-bate – falling ill due to summer heat – only becomes more prevalent. There are plenty of ways to stave off natsu-bate, but it's hard not to feel frustrated at the thought that somewhere along the way, summer went from a season to enjoy to a season to survive.

But we're relatively lucky. Miyazaki is by the sea, cooled by a coastal breeze. Consider the concrete jungle of Tokyo. And there's one aspect of Japanese summers that always makes being outside a bit more enjoyable, at least for me: the cicadas. We don't have cicadas in the UK, and even if we did, I can't imagine they'd have the personality of Japanese ones. The soundscape they provide is overwhelming, and their relentless cries seem to defy the notion of natsu-bate. When all is sluggish and overheated, the cicadas are vibrantly alive – until they're not, and their bodies fall unceremoniously out of the trees.

As we move through summer, you'll hear the variety of songs they sing: there's the oil-frying crackle of abura-zemi, the vaguely annoyed sounding min-min, the whimsical chirrup of tsuku-tsuku-boshi. And as we approach the end of summer, on warm dozy evenings you'll hear my personal favourite, the higurashi, plaintive but strangely consoling. As the sweat cools on your skin, listen out for them.
