

Confessions of a scaredy-cat

#### "An Earth-shattering Realization"

Two months ago, I felt like the title of this column had become obsolete. Life in Japan isn't as anxiety-inducing as it seemed it would be at the start. What more do I have to confess?

But lately I've been having suspicious nightmares, that start out normal, but end - literally - in disaster.

Torrential rains battering the streets, the ground suddenly throwing me off my feet with violent shaking. The stab of terror and realization that oh god, it's happening, this is it. The Big One. I always knew about natural disasters in Japan. I was never scared of them until 8 August, when Miyazaki was slammed with a 7.1 magnitude quake,

followed by a stomach-plummeting bulletin: Caution required for Megaquake.

As the title of this column suggests, I scare easily. I catastrophize with the best of them. But for once, my anxieties were proportional to the threat. The Nankai Trough Megathrust Earthquake happening is not a matter of if, but when. And when it happens, the damage will be almost unimaginable. For most it's been an abstract far-off danger, but August's quake brought us closer to the possibility than anyone would like. At the time, I asked Miyazaki locals how they felt about the possibility of the Nankai megaquake hitting, and the response was unanimous: it's a terrifying prospect. But shou ga nai, right? You can't predict it or prevent it, all you can do is prepare.

This philosophy was hard to accept at first, but now that I have done these preparations - getting an emergency bag together, for instance – I think I understand the cognitive dissonance a little better. Once you've truly done everything you can, and trust in your ability to survive whatever happens, your brain quickly gives up worrying over the part it can't control.
