Confessions of a scaredy-cat

"Out with the old, in with the new"

The change is gradual, but it is happening. New faces are replacing familiar ones. I am speaking of course about the new yen bank notes that began circulation in July. There's no doubt that some updates were in order, particularly the anti-counterfeiting measures, but having only spent a cumulative year and a half in the country, I still developed a bit of an attachment to the old designs. So, I'd like to commemorate them here.

First, Hideyo Noguchi, or "the hot guy on the 1000 yen note" as I used to refer to him. He was a highly influential bacteriologist, and I'll miss him. In the UK, you get used to seeing Her Majesty's dignified-but-craggy face on all the notes (though one day, she too will be replaced by her far less charismatic successor). I've been fond of this 老万円(0

wavy-haired handsome devil since my first trip to Japan.

Next, two legendary women writers, separated by 1000 years: Higuchi Ichiyo on the 5000 yen and Murasaki Shikibu on the 2000 yen (a note so rare it's not accepted by conbini ATMs). Murasaki famously wrote the first ever psychological novel in The Tale of Genji, and Higuchi was a pre-eminent writer of the Meiji period. The 五千円 2000 yen is sticking around (though good luck finding one!), but as someone who studied modern Japanese women's literature in some depth, the loss of Higuchi Ichiyo is a sad one.

And lastly, Fukuzawa Yukichi who has decorated the 10,000 yen since 1984. He contributed to Japan's development in the widest ranging ways, from education to philosophy to politics, while never holding an official position. Hopefully he continues to be remembered after he leaves our day to day lives.
