

### Miyazaki Prefecture CIR **Katherine Kessler**

Five years ago, I watched the first sunrise of the decade from my dormitory balcony in Kobe. It felt meaningful to start the new year in Japan rather than my home country, knowing I'd be there till August. 2020 was a landmark, a fresh start. I had a lot of resolutions for that year, most of them to do with living life to the fullest in Japan: get a part time job, make friends, travel, become fluent in Japanese.

2020 ended up being something of a let-down, to put it mildly.
