Confessions of a scaredy-cat

"The Open Road"

Here we are in the new year, and I have another confession for you all: it's been nine months and I have seen almost none of Miyazaki's rural areas. Not Takachiho Gorge, not Aya forest, not Nichinan, and not Toi no Misaki, with its unique wild horses. Apart from a few one-off day trips, my spare time has been spent enjoying the low-key pleasures of the city.

There is a simple reason behind this: I can't drive. While this fact tends to elicit reactions of dismay from local and foreign residents of Miyazaki alike, it has so far been surprisingly fine. As my job involves going to schools in some far-flung parts of the prefecture, I've had to be quite creative and patient with Miyazaki's limited public transport options, but I've made it work. What can I say? I was raised in the city. And truthfully, I can't imagine myself behind the wheel. It's so alien that I've just never considered it an option.

But the thing is, I really would like to see the Misaki horses. I checked how long it would take by public transport, and the answer was effectively a day – I'd need to spend a night in Nichinan, which would book up a whole weekend. And the Aya suspension bridge can only be reached by car, turns out. Maybe one day I'll hitch a ride with a friend to these places, and if that doesn't happen then I can live without seeing them. But I'm finding myself tempted by the total freedom that driving a car would bring. And this temptation – more than a feeling of obligation – might just be the thing that finally gets me out of that can't-do mindset. So, here's my tentative promise to learn to drive this year. Or at least take one lesson.
