Notice for 2025 National Census

The census is the most important statistical survey. It covers all people living in Japan and their households.

The census is an important survey that can be used for improving the living environment, disaster prevention planning, and various other administrative measures indispensable to our daily lives.

O Who is counted in the census

All people (including non-Japanese people) living in Japan as of October 1, 2025 and their households will be counted in the survey.

From late September 2025, census takers will visit each household and distribute census documents. You can respond either online or by completing the printed census questionnaire and mailing it or handing it to the census taker. (The census will be conducted according to the process in the diagram below.)

I did pass in the end, despite that initial glaring mistake, and my safety checks apparently being "too late and not thorough enough" (that was the one thing I thought I was doing right!) I'm guessing the real final exam won't be as lenient, but I do feel more confident now. That solo road trip to Kushima is getting closer all the time!
