

## **Foreign Residents Notice for 2025 National Census**

The census is the most important statistical survey. It covers all people living in Japan and their households.

The census is an important survey that can be used for improving the living environment, disaster prevention planning, and various other administrative measures indispensable to our daily lives.

Who is counted in the census All people (including non-Japanese people) living in Japan as of October 1, 2025 and their households will be counted in the survey.

From late September 2025, census takers will visit each household and distribute census documents. You can respond either online or by completing the printed census questionnaire and mailing it or handing it to the census taker. (The census will be conducted according to the process in the diagram below.)

## Confessions of a scaredy - cat "Why You Should Go To A Wrestling Show In Japan"

It's been a while since I subjected you to my favourite topic in this column, but I have a mission this time! I'm determined to convince at least one of you to try something new and go to a wrestling show. To clarify, I mean the professional (read: fake) kind of wrestling, known as puro resu in Japanese.

Some of you may have grown up watching American professional wrestling, with its oiled and spray-tanned musclemen playing cartoonish heroes and villains. The fundamentals of puro are the same: good guys will often face bad guys, bad guys will try to cheat, sometimes chairs are involved. But the in-ring action is more realistic and hard-hitting. The wrestlers tend to be smaller and lither than the Hulk Hogan archetype and often perform jaw-dropping aerial maneuvers. Matches are dynamic and thrilling to watch live, with action frequently spilling out into the crowds, meaning you might have to scramble out of the way of a heated melee among the folding chairs.

Wrestling is as much about the storytelling as the action, and even if it's your first time watching, you'll find yourself joining in with other people in the audience cheering on their oshi, and booing with outrage at the heels. Puro also often has a quirky humour to it, so you can expect to see dancing, wacky costumes and physical comedy thrown in with the athletic showcases. If you're in Tokyo looking for something different to do, I recommend checking out a show at Korakuen Hall, a small and vibrant venue with a long tradition of wrestling shows, where fans get especially raucous.

Or to put it another way: if you like any combination of martial arts, theatre, idols, or anime, go check out a wrestling show! You won't wregret it.
