

Glamping

“Glamping” is a portmanteau of “glamorous” and “camping”. It offers the appeal of an outdoorsy experience camping in the heart of nature, while enjoying comfortable accommodation, luxurious meals and activities. Here are some of the glamping facilities Miyazaki Prefecture has to offer.

○TOIGLAM SOLASITA (Kushima City)

A glamping site on Cape Toi, home to wild horses. It’s a relaxing getaway with ensuite dome-shaped rooms, views of the Pacific Ocean by day and a sky full of stars by night.



○CALM LANAI HARBOR (Nichinan City)

A private harbour overlooking the Hyuga-nada Sea filled with sumptuous accommodation options including glamping tents, cottages, campervans, and land-based ships that can be slept in. For an additional fee, guests can also enjoy fishing and cruising.

○Hyuga village (Hyuga City)

A facility combining glamping domes with a campsite, as well as dome tents with private dog yards. Each one comes with a fire pit, allowing you to enjoy the unique outdoor experience of gathering around a campfire.

○OceansideRanch (Miyazaki City)

A retreat to spend a holiday in style, in a wooden decked cabin with the ocean stretching out before your eyes. There are hot tubs on the decks, and cabins with barrel saunas. And in the on-site café, you can enjoy coffee from the New York-based Brooklyn Roasting Company.



Now that the weather’s getting warmer, why not try something a little out of the ordinary and go to a glamping site?
